- Registered Apprenticeship has been talked about a lot in the past several years, and we're continuing to expand.
- Work-based learning includes models other than registered apprenticeship, so we are expanding our scope to look at some of these other areas, and how DLI can play a role in expanding WBL statewide.
- MT is part of a 6-state project under the National Governor's Association (NGA) called the WBL Policy Academy looking to scale WBL statewide
